# Newsletter #2 - December 2023 wrap-up

We opened the year with the establishment of the *Heritopolis Society* by Jay as a formal Society based in Seoul at the Konkuk University. The Statutes were approved together with a background Paper on Metropolitan Heritage – *Heritopolis* outlining *the metropolis as a heritage – the heritage that shapes the metropolis.* 

#### The events

In April: A proactive conversation and to introduce the *Heritopolis Society* at the School of Architecture and Design at New York Tech and supported by Antonella from the Politecnico di Milano. This was followed by a hybrid colloquium at the University of Guadalajara and supported by Antonella from Politecnico di Milano, Université de Montréal, and Lucia from the UNESCO-Unitwin Network Chair for Sustainable Development, **The metropolis as a cultural heritage and the integration of green and blue infrastructures in metropolization processes.** 

In May the AMB team prepared the Barcelona Statement on the Metropolitan Agenda towards the UN-Habitat Assembly adopted:

vii. Encourage global, national and local leaders to support cultural and natural heritage-related initiatives and acknowledge their significance for understanding metropolises as a legacy towards sustainable development. This includes welcoming the recently established *Metropolitan Heritage International Society based in Seoul*, with a view to safeguarding metropolitan heritage, promoting creativity and fostering diverse forms of cultural expression as essential assets for the development of inclusive, cohesive, prosperous and environmentally sustainable metropolitan areas.

Two webinars took place in April and May each moderated by a Research Forum member - The metropolis as a heritage moderated by Daniel Athias De Almeida; Mapping heritage of the metropolis – this discussion took place in the wake of the devastating earthquake in southern Turkey and the implications for Istanbul and the presentation of the Results and systematisation methodology of the Global Survey, moderated by Can Memis.

In June, Eric, Antonella, Claus-Peter and Mike participated in the UN-Habitat Assembly.

During the Assembly, the Heritopolis partners also participated in a multilateral meeting on Metropolitan Areas and SEDATU <sup>1</sup>.

Application to EU COST HERMIT - HERitage of the Metropolis In Transformation. HERMIT aims to: (1) Identify the tangible and intangible attributes of heritage as carriers of the values of the metropolis (2), Analyse issues and gaps in urban-rural linkages of the metropolis through placebased research, and (3) Provide good-practice guidelines for evaluating trends in metropolitanization based on the Quintuple Helix. These will be achieved by five Working Groups, leading debates in the form of webinars, workshops, conference, and dissemination activities.






#### **Research Forum**

# Monthly meetings



A policy debate was instituted in October with David and Francesco leading a discussion on **Localising the SDGs – The Power of Nature**. In November Jo Ivey Boufford (NYU) gave a holistic approach to Cities and Health.
